Sunday, JUNE 12

➔ 10:00 – 11:30h

Guided tour of Oceanarium (<http://www.oceanario.pt/>)

Need to be in front of the Oceanarium at 9:45h



Opened in 1998, the Lisbon Oceanário was the centerpiece of the XXth Century's last World Fair, themed "The Oceans, a Heritage for the Future", and eternally binds Lisbon to the Oceans. With over one million visitors per year, the Oceanário welcomes the largest number of visitors anywhere in the country.

Guided tour of Calouste Gulbenkian Museum (www.museu.gulbenkian.pt)

Meeting point – the entrance (Address: Av. de Berna 45A, 1067-001 Lisboa)

Museu Calouste Gulbenkian is a museum in Lisbon, Portugal, containing a collection of ancient, and some modern art. The museum was founded according to Calouste Gulbenkian's last will, in order to accommodate and display his private art collection that now belongs to the Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation



Calouste Gulbenkian (23 March 1869–20 July 1955) was an Armenian businessman and philanthropist. He played a major role in making the petroleum reserves of the Middle East available to Western development. By the end of his life, he had become one of the world's wealthiest individuals and his art acquisitions considered one of the greatest private collections.

Enjoy Lisbon from the Tagus River! Transtejo gives us a unique opportunity to go on a pleasant cruise and experience magical moments, with an amazing view of the city and all the monuments along the river in the background. The cruise will first take us up the river, to see to the new part of the city, where the 1998 Lisbon World Exposition took place (Parque das Nações), and then go west to see the historical part of the city and emblematic monuments like Torre de Belém. There is a bar service with soft drinks and waters on the boat.

Train leaves from ''Lisboa - Santa Apolonia'' Station (<http://www.cp.pt/cp/>) at 9:36h and arrives to ''Sintra'' Station at 11:00

➔ 14:00h (approx.)

Walking tour of the city, including a visit to Quinta da Regaleira (<http://www.regaleira.pt/>), located near the historic center of Sintra and classified as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Along with other palaces in this area (such as the Pena National Palace, the Monserrate Palace and the Seteais Palace), it is one of the principal tourist attractions of Sintra. It consists of a romantic palace and chapel, and a luxurious park featuring lakes, grottoes, wells, benches, fountains, and a vast array of exquisite constructions.

Flexible return to Lisbon by train from ''Sintra'' Station, leaving every half an hour and taking slightly over 1 hour to get back to ''Lisboa - Santa Apolonia'' Station.
